## Rationale

Governing Bodies of maintained schools are responsible, under the latest legislation, for putting in place measures which promote good pupil behaviour and discipline. This policy is linked to the DFE document Exclusions from Maintained Schools, Academies and PRU's in England.

The Headteacher is required to act in accordance with any written statement of general principles provided by the Governing Body, and to have regard to any guidance they may have to offer in relation to particular matters. In effect the Governors are responsible for setting the policies of the school and the Headteacher is responsible for the day to day arrangements for securing good order and discipline within the school.

The school should have in place the following policies which need to be reviewed by the Governing Body:-

- Pupil Discipline/Behaviour
- Anti-bullying
- PHSCE
- Equal Opportunities
- Home/School Agreement
- Disability Discrimination Code of Practice
- Race Relations
- SEN
- Vulnerable Children

## Aims

In order to achieve high standards of behaviour and good discipline, schools will need to develop and maintain whole school policies on behaviour management. Such policies should ensure the highest level of consensus between staff, pupils and parents.

Prior to exclusion, we, at High Craggs Primary School will ensure that all possible preventative strategies are used and procedures are followed. Refer to the Behaviour Policy.
